

# Good and bad habitat posters

## You need:

- Paper or card
- Pencils
- Colouring pens or pencils

**After children have learnt about what whales and dolphins need in their habitats, and the threats that can impact them, they can design a poster to show what a good and a bad whale dolphin habitat look like.**

**1**

Each child will need some paper, a pencil and some colouring supplies.



**2**

Ask each child to draw a poster with a good whale and dolphin habitat on one half, and a bad habitat on the other half. Encourage children to think about what they've learnt about whales and dolphins:

- What needs to be included in the "good" habitat?
- What threats could be represented in the "bad" habitat? For example litter, pollution, boats, noise and fishing nets.
